Monica Petersen Memorial Service Link - Human Trafficking Research Died in Haiti: "We May Never Know Exactly What Happened"

Human Trafficking is a long-standing problem in Haiti, as have been assassinations and death squads. Anyone who stands up for the poor and disenfranchised is always at risk. Our blog was initially started in loving memory of an assassinated Haitian who had been targetted as an Aristide supporter.

If you don't have time to listen to the entire memorial, please listen to the last few minutes. In the last few minutes of the memorial service, the speaker explains that Monica went to Haiti to form an NGO to coordinate the activities of other NGOs. She believed that working in Haiti was not an impossible task but her next challenge; that Haitians were beautiful people living in impossible conditions created by a system imposed on them and wished to work with the people toward their own liberation. The speaker says that they are in a state of shock; they mourn; and "may never know exactly what happened". He says that "We remember a smile that will dispel the dark".

[NB-update: While the above may sound peculiar, we are talking about a death which occurred recently in Haiti, and it is indeed true that they will never know for certain what happened. Too many things could happen. So, please be respectful of this lady's death, and of her elderly parents, and refrain from treating her as a political football. She apparently went to collect facts about human trafficking in Haiti - something which has gone on since at least the Duvalier years - probably before- and has long been even institutionalized as "restavek" where poor families send their young children to stay with wealthier families and work for them. <https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Restavek> This fact alone opens up all sorts of possibilities of exploitation. Duvalier sold Haitians by the head to work in the Dominican Cane fields. So, if you are interested in this topic and case, please carefully read and collect your information, rather than jumping to conclusions. Please listen to her memorial. Perhaps start with Paul Farmer's book, "The Uses of Haiti". The 110 pages that her research director seeks a publisher for was a critique of a textbook that he felt was methodologically flawed, and contrary to reddit suggestions appears to have nothing directly to do with her trip to Haiti. We also apologize for having written the time of the memorial as 11 am rather than 1230 pm. We first posted this quickly, while half asleep, in case people wanted to watch it live stream.
